Summary

The purpose of this report is to seek endorsement from the Committee for the temporary road closure of Hargrave Avenue, Albion Park Rail as per the attached Traffic Control Plan (**Attachment 1**) for Sunday 20 November 2022.

Background

Council has received a request from Illawarra Convoy seeking approval for the temporary full road closure of Airport Road and Hargrave Avenue, Albion Park Rail for the i98FM Illawarra Convoy 2022 event on Sunday 20 November 2022. The applicant has advised the proposed road closure is for convoy vehicles to access the site within Shellharbour Airport and Traffic Controllers will be onsite to manage C1 Speed Indoor Karting entry and exit via Hargrave Avenue. As per the attached Traffic Control Plan (TCP), the applicant has noted the Hargrave Avenue road closure will be open after 10am (see **Attachment 1**).

It should be noted a 4 tonne load limit applies to Poplar Avenue and any vehicle over 4 tonnes will not be permitted to access Poplar Avenue.

Committee Recommendation

That Council approve the temporary full road closure of Hargrave Avenue, Albion Park Rail for this event as shown in Attachment 1, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The applicant must inform all residents/businesses within or with access/frontage to any property who may be impacted by this temporary partial closure, at least seven days and then one day before the closure via a letterbox drop.
- 2. The applicant must cater for the access requirements of any resident/business/organisations with direct access to their properties that will be impacted by the partial closure, with accredited Traffic Controllers at all times while the closure is operational.
- 3. The applicant must supply and erect any barriers and traffic signs necessary for the road closure as stipulated by the approved Traffic Control Plan (TCP) and remove them at the completion of the works.
- 4. Council must be indemnified against all claims for damage or injury that may result from either the activities or from the occupation of part of the public way during the activities. A copy of Public Liability Insurance Cover to the value of \$20,000,000 shall be provided to Council prior to the event and Council must be listed as in interested party on the insurance.
- 5. Council must be reimbursed for the cost of repair of any damage caused to Council property as a result of the activities.
- 6. The applicant must inform all Emergency Services of the proposed road closure (that is NSW Police, Fire Brigade, Ambulance, State Emergency Services and Transport for NSW).
- 7. Shellharbour City Council reserves the right to cancel this approval at any time.





8.2. The Kingsway, Barrack Heights – Delineation of Central Median and Installation of BB Linemarking

Summary

The purpose of this report is to seek endorsement from the Committee for the amendment and new installation of delineation along The Kingsway (as shown in **Attachment 1**). The amendments include:

- E5 edge linemarking of the central median at The Kingsway and Lake Entrance Road, Barrack Heights.
- Double Barrier (BB) centre linemarking at The Kingsway and Messenger Road, and
- Extension of the current Double Barrier (BB) centre linemarking along The Kingsway

Background

Council has received a customer request to review the delineation at the intersection of The Kingsway and Strata Ave, Barrack Heights due to parked vehicles restricting the turning path from Strata Ave onto The Kingsway.

Council's Transport team conducted an on-site investigation of the location and it is recommended that the current Double Barrier (BB) centre linemarking at the intersection of The Kingsway and Strata Avenue be extended 4 metres to ensure at least 10 metres clearance from the intersection of the two streets and to deter drivers from restricting the turning path from Strata Ave onto The Kingsway (as shown **Attachment 2**).

Following further investigation of the adjoining streets of The Kingsway, it is recommended:

- 1. 15 metres of Double Barrier (BB) centre linemarking be installed along Messenger Road approaching The Kingsway in both directions to forewarn drivers of the transverse line at the Stop sign.
- 2. E5 edge linemarking be installed around the central median at the intersection of The Kingsway and Lake Entrance Road to enhance delineation and encourage drivers to keep clear of the central median







8.3. Timbs Road, Oak Flats - Delineation of Central Median and Installation of BB linemarking

Summary

The purpose of this report is to seek endorsement from the Committee for the installation of 20 metres of Double Barrier (BB) centre linemarking at the intersection of Timbs Rd and Government Rd, Oak Flats, and the installation of E5 edge linemarking to delineate the central median at the intersection of Timbs Rd and The Esplanade, Oak Flats (as shown in **Attachment 1**).

Background

Council has received a customer request to review the delineation of Timbs Road, Oak Flats, due to road safety concerns as there is currently no linemarking along the entirety of the road.

Council's Transport team conducted an on-site investigation and it is recommended 20 metres of Double Barrier (BB) centre linemarking be installed at Timbs Rd on the approach to Government Rd to forewarn drivers on the transverse line at the 'Stop' sign (as shown in **Attachment 2**). It is also recommended the delineation of the central median at the intersection of Timbs Rd and The Esplanade, Oak Flats, be enhance by providing E5 edge linemarking and 43 metres of Double Barrier (BB) centre linemarking to forewarn drivers of the intersection and encourage drivers to keep clear of the central median.

It should be noted, the proposed changes will not impact kerbside parking along Timbs Road, Oak Flats.


