8. Traffic Reports

8.1. Installation of Emergency Vehicles Excepted Sign - Webb Lane, Albion Park

Committee Recommendation

That Council approve the installation of an "Emergency Vehicles Excepted" sign (r9-200n) at Webb Lane, Albion Park in accordance with **Attachment 2** and relevant Australian Standards subject to the "Emergency Vehicles Excepted" sign being duplicated under the other "No Right Turn" sign.

8.2. Warilla Streetscape Stage 2

Committee Recommendation

That Council approve the signage and linemarking plan for the Warilla Streetscape Stage 2 works as shown in **Attachment 2** subject to:

1. The disabled parking spaces being installed in accordance with relevant Australian Standards.

2. The proposed footpath on Beverley Avenue be extended to the disabled car parking kerb ramps.

8.3. School Zone Infrastructure Sub-Program - Detailed Designs

Committee Recommendation

That Council:

- Approve the installation of a raised wombat (pedestrian crossing) and associated signage/linemarking at Oldfield Street, Warilla as shown in Attachment 1 and all advisory speeds being revised in accordance with Section 3.3.5 of NSW Speed Zoning Guidelines.
- Approve the installation of a raised wombat (pedestrian crossing) at Stradbroke Avenue, Shell Cove as shown in Attachment 1 subject to the signage and linemarking being installed in accordance with Attachment 2 and all advisory speeds being revised in accordance with Section 3.3.5 of NSW Speed Zoning Guidelines.
- 3. Approve the installation of a raised wombat (pedestrian crossing) at Wentworth Street, Oak Flats as shown in Attachment 1 subject to the longitudinal linemarking being installed in accordance with Attachment 3 and all advisory speeds being revised in accordance with Section 3.3.5 of NSW Speed Zoning Guidelines.
- 4. Approve the installation of a raised wombat (pedestrian crossing) at Willinga Road, Flinders as shown in Attachment 1 and all advisory speeds being revised in accordance with Section 3.3.5 of NSW Speed Zoning Guidelines.
- 5. Approve the upgrade to the pedestrian refuge at Ulster Avenue, Warilla as shown in Attachment 1.

8.4. Pedestrian Crossing - Airport Road, Albion Park Rail

Committee Recommendation

That Council approve the signage and linemarking plan at Airport Road, Albion Park Rail as shown in **Attachment 2** subject to:

1. the 'No stopping' sign on approach to the pedestrian crossing (southbound traffic) being relocated closer (in-line) with the parking lane edgeline.

- 2. all 'No Stopping' signage (r5-400) be in accordance with Transport for NSW Standard Signs.
- 3. The zebra crossing linemarking being widened to 3.6m in accordance with TfNSW supplement to AS1742
