8.1. Benson Avenue, Shellharbour City Centre - Proposed 2 hour On-street Parking Restrictions

8.5 Boomerang Avenue, Albion Park Rail

The Manager Floodplain and Transport, Adam De Clouett, sought Committee support to amend the 4 hour parking signs on Boomerang Avenue, Albion Park Rail in order to reinstate a time restricted 4 hour parking - 9:00pm to 4:00am. This is to correct an error on the previously approved plans submitted to the Traffic Committee on the 2 March 2022, which indicated no time restriction on the 4P signs in this area.

9. General Business

Tongarra Road at Russell Street, Albion Park. Paul Grebert submitted a request from the Albion Park Chamber of Commerce to consider yellow hatched linemarking at the junction of Tongarra Road and Russell Street, Albion park Rail. .

Transport for NSW, Andy Gaudiosi, advised that this would be investigated along with placement of appropriate signage 'Do not queue across the intersection'.

Following the completion of the Albion Park Bypass a number of streets in Albion Park have noticed improvements to traffic movement. However, some are noticing negative impacts to traffic. The question was asked if traffic light signalling could be reviewed by Transport for NSW.

Transport for NSW, Andy Gaudiosi, advised that this would be investigated.

Senior Constable Craig Gray, NSW Police reiterated the Police feedback from the previous Traffic Committee, stating that the NSW Police regularly monitor and enforce the speed limits within the Shell Cove area and noted the request from more surveillance in Albion Park.
