Public Exhibition - Proposed New Licence – Part Lot 304, DP 122303 – 110 Croome Road, Croom

Council is proposing to grant a new licence over part of Lot 304 DP 122303, 110 Croome Road, Croom, being Council-owned Community Land, for a term of five (5) years. The licence will permit the occupation and use of the premises in accordance with the terms of the agreement.

The licenced area will be used for the purpose of the agistment of four horses.

Council is required to advertise this proposal under Section 47A of the *Local Government Act 1993* for a period of twenty-eight (28) days.

At the end of the submission period, Council will formally consider whether to enter into a new licence agreement.
