That Council give delegation to the General Manager to approve and authorise Road Names which comply with the adopted Policy as amended from time to time.

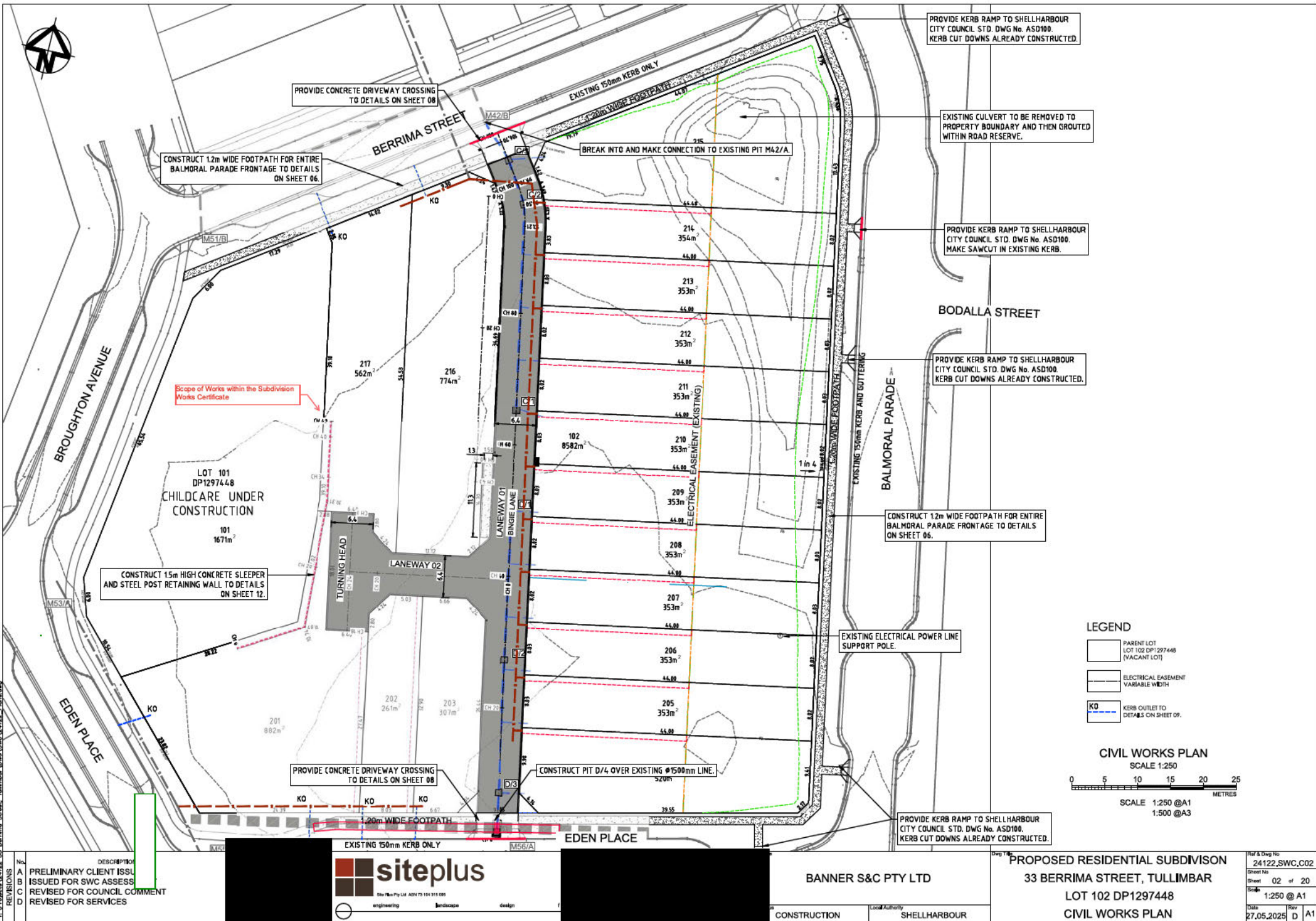

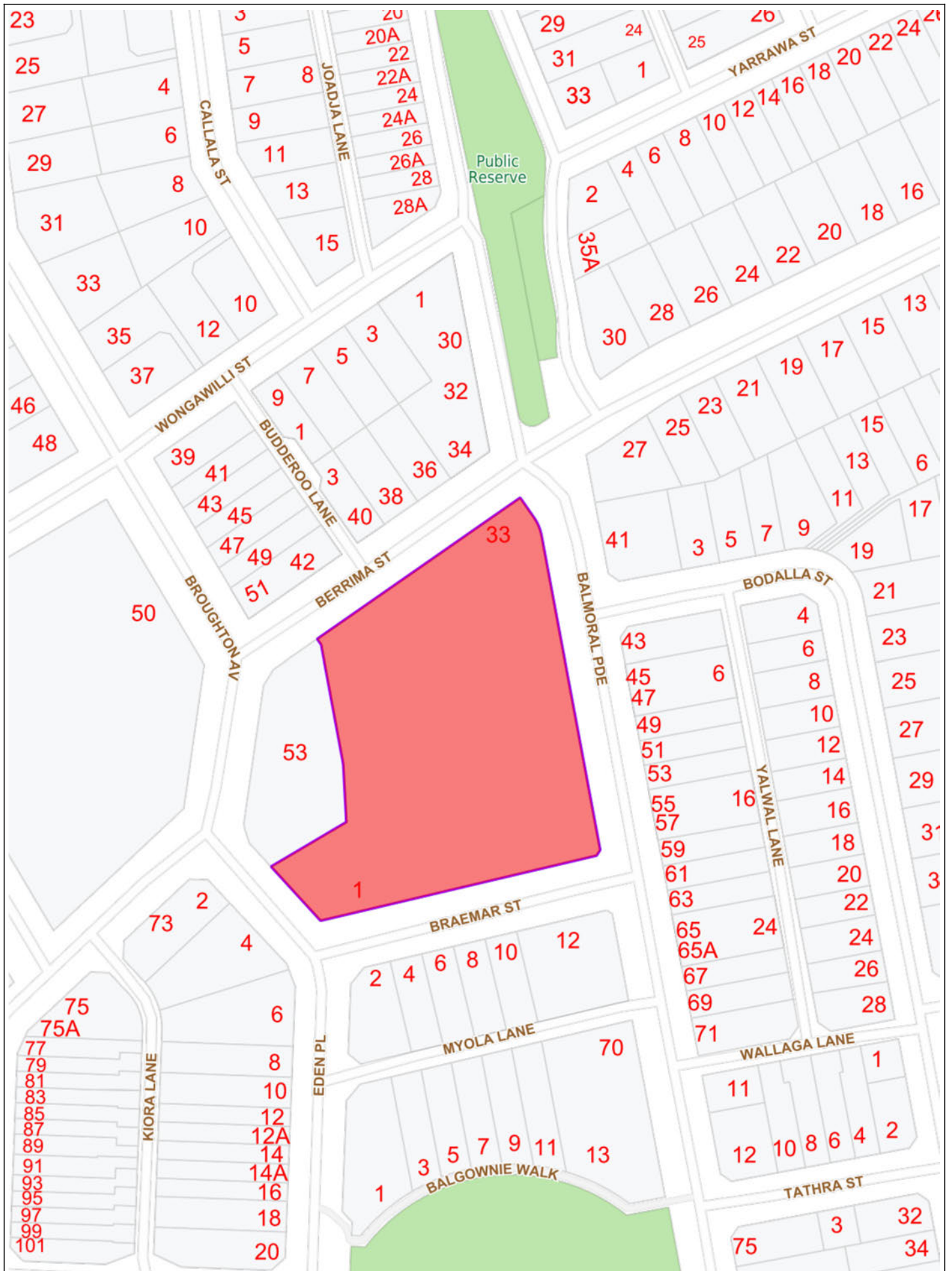
