

2025 Shellharbour ClubGRANTS Applicant Fact Sheet

What is ClubGRANTS funding?

ClubGRANTS is a community funding scheme that ensures larger registered clubs in NSW contribute to the provision of front-line services in their local communities and provide much needed support to community organisations, groups and disadvantaged members of the community. The scheme was introduced in 1998 by the NSW Government.

Under the guidelines, the Scheme includes 3 funding categories:

Category 1 Supports community welfare and social services; community development; community health services; and employment assistance activities.

Category 2 Provides funding for general community development and support activities, such as junior sport. (ie. traditional areas of club expenditure).

Category 3 Is a state-wide fund that supports large-scale community infrastructure projects, such as hospitals and sporting facilities.

Shellharbour **Category One** Funding Information for applicants

What is eligible under <u>Category 1</u> funding?

Eligible **Category 1 expenditure** is for projects and/or services that contribute to the welfare and broader social fabric of the local community and aimed at improving the living standards of low income and disadvantaged people.

The Shellharbour Local Committee establishes Local Priorities for the Shellharbour LGA. (Outlined on following page).

When does Category 1 funding open?

Applications for Shellharbour ClubGRANTS Category One funding will open at 9:00am on **1 February 2025** and close at 4:00pm on **31 May 2025**.

How do I apply for Category 1 funding?

Register and select the Shellharbour Round. You only need to apply once as the application will be reviewed by all clubs within the Shellharbour Local Committee.

Having trouble filling out the online application form?

If you do not have access to a computer or require assistance with filling out the form online, please contact your local club to arrange an appointment for application assistance.

When do I hear about the outcome of my application?

After the application process closes in May, the Shellharbour ClubGRANTS local committee meets in June and July to review all applications and make recommendations for funding. Clubs then agree to fund particular applications either in whole or to part fund the project with another club. Applicants will be advised if their application is successful or unsuccessful during August.

If your application for funding is successful you will be required to complete a ClubsNSW Standard Funding Reporting Form at the end of the project. Organisations that have not submitted their report/progress forms for previous ClubGRANTS funding rounds will not be considered for future funding. You will need to Log In to your online form and click on the link to complete reports.

Shellharbour 2025 ClubGRANTS Category One Local Priorities

Shellharbour ClubGRANTS Local Committee will consider not-for-profit organisations / projects / programs that are delivered within the Shellharbour LGA for the benefit of the Shellharbour community.

AND PRIORITISE

(these are not listed in priority order)

Initiatives that support vulnerable or disadvantaged community members, in particular those outlined below.

Social and Community

- Increasing the proportion of people who feel and are socially connected.
- Access to transport services and programs to improve access and connection.

Empowerment

- Increase opportunities for people to make decisions affecting them and their lives such as access to information, services and technology.

Safety

- Enhancing safety and the perception of safety within a community.
- All children are safe from harm.
- All people are safe from domestic and family violence.

Home

- Increasing the number of people who have a safe and affordable place to live.
- Enhancing the public perception of homeless people.

Education and Skills

- Enhancing opportunities for people to learn, achieve and contribute.

Economic

- Decreasing the proportion of young people who are disengaged.
- Greater access to employment for disadvantaged groups.
- Support vulnerable families and individuals with increased cost of living pressures.

Health

- Increasing access to services and programs among our vulnerable population groups.
- Keeping people healthy.
- Improve mental health and wellbeing.


> Improve outcomes for specific target groups within the Shellharbour community:

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- Culturally and linguistically diverse communities
- Refugees and emerging communities
- Those experiencing or at risk of homelessness, in particular women
- LGBTQIA+
- People 65 years and over
- People with disabilities and carers
- Families, in particular young families and expectant mothers
- Young people 12 24 years
- Children 0 5 years and pre-teens 8 14 years

Examples of programs that could be funded in Shellharbour

School breakfast programs, mental health programs, men's shed activities, individual and community resilience programs, recreation and social activities for people with disabilities, health promotion programs, community drug and alcohol awareness and education programs, respite support for carers, activities encouraging social connection, food security, local job creation schemes, projects supporting affordable or low cost accommodation, youth support programs, community transport programs, suicide prevention programs, food assist initiatives, social programs for isolated people, water awareness programs.

These projects contribute towards Objectives 1.1 and 1.2 of Shellharbour's Community Strategic Plan 2022 – 2032 - "We inspire community spirit" and "We are a liveable community".



Shellharbour Category 2 & 3 Funding Information for applicants

Who is eligible under Category 2 funding?

Eligible **Category 2 expenditure** is that expenditure allocated to community development and support activities and projects not listed under Category 1 and expenditure allocated to a club's core activities (such as sport, returned servicemen's league/veteran welfare, golf course and bowling green maintenance, including for wages paid to staff to carry out the maintenance).

When does Category 2 open and how do I apply?

Applications for Shellharbour ClubGRANTS Category Two funding are accepted throughout the year and rounds vary between each Club. Applicants should liaise directly with individual clubs and discuss details of your application with your local club manager.
